



2023-24 Deer Hunting Information for Residents



Season Dates: Sept. 9-17th, Oct. 1- Jan 31st



Shooting hours: ½ before sunrise to ½ after sunset

Setbacks: 150 ft from any occupiable dwelling. Hunters cannot shoot over a road and cannot trespass on private property

Archery Hunting

- Normally from elevated stand
- Shots are within 40 yards
- Only one two party archery incident in NY history
- Trail cameras often used to document deer's patterns

- New York State law absolves landowners from liability for non-paying recreationists engaged in hunting
- All hunters should have a license. **2023-24 is Orange**
- Hunters may also ask permission to retrieve deer that run further than expected

*Hunter harassment- No one can intentionally interfere with lawful hunting.

*It is illegal to feed deer any time of year in NY

*Nissequogue Village code requires hunters to carry written permission from property owner(s) while hunting
